# CAMP LSA INFORMATION

## **Camp Staff:**

Camp LSA is staffed by LSA's teaching staff and behavioral specialists.

## **Backpack Hooks/Cubbies:**

Every camper is expected to empty their cubbies and backpack hooks at the end of the day. Do not leave items behind.

## **Incident Reports:**

Anytime that your child is hurt you will receive an incident report (IR). Depending on the severity of the accident, we may inform you by phone.

## **Sunscreen:**

If you want your child to apply sunscreen daily, complete the form with your registration and bring your child's sunscreen labeled with their name to the front office.

## **Extra Clothing:**

Campers must provide a complete change of clothing to remain on campus.

## **Absences:**

If your child will be absent for the day, please notify the administration at [mnadell@learningspringsacademy.com](mailto:mnadell@learningspringsacademy.com) or call the office at 408-979-9769 by 8:30 AM.

## **Medication Request Guidelines:**

- If your child needs medication, please email us at [mnadell@learningspringsacademy.com](mailto:mnadell@learningspringsacademy.com) and we will send you a medication form to be completed by the parents or legal guardian and returned with the medication in its original packaging.
- All medication, lotions, ointments, require a medication form and will not be administered without it.
- All medication will be returned on the camper's last day of camp.
- All life-threatening medication needs to be in written form with a doctor's note and will remain at camp.

## **Meals:**

- All snacks and meals are provided by the families.
- All snacks and meals must be peanut and nut free.

## **Attire:**

Campers should come in clothing appropriate for the weather. **Shoes must fully cover the entire foot. Sandals must have toe covering and heel straps**

# PLAN

At Camp LSA, our main goal is to facilitate a positive perception of learning and develop lasting memories of the camp experience. Our camp staff are experienced, caring, patient and enthusiastic.

## **Information for New Families**

To support a smooth transition and help you become familiar with our school, we offer the following process for families joining Camp LSA:

1. **Informational Phone Call**  
We will schedule a phone call with our Executive Director to provide an overview of Camp LSA's programs, answer any questions, and discuss your family's specific needs.
2. **School Tour**  
Following the phone call, we will arrange a personal tour of our campus to give you a firsthand look at our facilities and daily activities.
3. **Student Observation**  
We will then schedule a student observation to ensure our programs align with their behavioral and educational goals and to determine if there will be a need for a 1:1 behavior therapist to support your child.
4. **Required Documentation**  
To better understand your child's needs and provide appropriate support, we will also request relevant documentation, such as assessments and copies of Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and behavior plans.

We are committed to working closely with families to ensure a welcoming and supportive experience for every child.

During summer camp, there are clear set boundaries. Part of teaching children is guidance. When campers have conflict, we do not immediately intervene unless they are hurting each other. We will allow the campers to resolve problems themselves through our close observation. However, if the campers are unable to resolve this, then there are several techniques that we often use. We will also encourage campers to ask for adult assistance if they



feel it is needed. Our staff and/or the camper's behavioral therapist (if assigned) will use one or more of the following techniques based on the camper. They are as follows:

**Redirection:** Directing them to a more positive activity. Sometimes this means choosing another activity that does not involve the original playmates.

**Conversations:** Having a conversation and explaining to the camper using logic and discussion about different scenarios can help a camper understand other perspectives

**Taking a break:** Often campers can become over stimulated by sound, activity, or actions. We encourage campers to take a break to regroup or regulate. We do that through removing them to a quieter space, providing sensory items such as yoga balls, trampolines, etc. Noise canceling headsets are also available.

**Choice:** Campers are given only two choices at a time. The choices are conducive to what we are trying to encourage at that moment and are positive.

**Positive Reinforcement:** Catching them while they are at their best through praises and words of encouragement goes a long way.

**Warning:** Everyone is given at least one warning before actions are taken. We need to maintain consistency and follow through before anything can be effective with campers.

**Incident Reports:** If a camper does become aggressive an incident report (IR) will be written for all parties involved.

These techniques will help the campers learn to cope with conflicts more effectively through the usage of words rather than physical actions. In talking with the campers, the words are very simple and straight to the point.

## CAMP LSA SICK POLICY

- Any communicable diseases must be reported to the administrative office immediately.
- Exposure notices will be sent home or emailed to all parents.
- As a camp policy, if your child is ill (cold/flu/stomach bug/etc.) or unable to participate in the daily function of the camp, they should not be at camp.
- If your child becomes ill while at camp, parents/guardians will be called to pick up their child. We ask that you pick up your child as promptly as possible, but within an hour's time.

# REGISTRATION

## Registration and Registration Fee due May 1st

To secure your slot for the summer camp program, you will have to submit the following:

### **Current LSA Students:**

- Camp registration form.
- Full payment on the due date(s) as listed on the registration form under "Payment Due".
- Any additional forms for medication and/or sunscreen.

### **New Campers:**

- Camp registration form.
- Full payment on the due date(s) as listed on the registration form under "Payment Due".
- Non-LSA student information form.
- Any additional forms for medication and/or sunscreen.

# ENROLLMENT POLICIES

### **Payment of fees:**

Payment is due on the dates listed on the registration form for the camps following that date. All families will have to complete the registration forms and submit them to the administration along with the fees. No camper is allowed to attend camp without pre-payment. Payments are non-refundable, non-prorated, and non-transferable. Registration for the weeks requested are not complete without payment.

### **Camp enrollment capacity:**

There will be a maximum of 15 spaces for each camp. Due to the limited space, it will be first come first serve. Once the number of spaces is filled, the camp will be closed.

**Behavioral Therapists:**

BTs are assigned based upon enrollment. BTs are assigned on a first come first serve basis. The fee for BT services is separate from the camp fees and are billed separately. A separate summer BT contract must be signed by parents.

**Camp Switching:**

Switching of camp selection can only be accommodated based on availability and two weeks prior notice. Please contact the camp director with questions.

**Cancellations:**

The camp will only be canceled if there is a lack of enrollment. In that case, fees will be credited or refunded. Acts of God including extreme weather, power outages, viral infections that threaten the health of staff and children, etc. may also cause a full or partial cancelation. There is no refund for these cases. There will be no refund if you decide to withdraw or cancel.

June 9 <sup>th</sup> – 13th	<b>The Vast Ocean:</b> Campers explore the ocean, it's inhabitants and their environment.
June 16 <sup>th</sup> – 20th *	<b>Sports and Games:</b> Campers learn and play both outdoor sports such as soccer and basketball, along with different games and the sportsmanship and cooperation needed for both
June 23rd– 27th	<b>The Outer Limits:</b> Explore the universe and planets during this week's camp.
June 30 <sup>th</sup> July 3rd *	<b>The Great Outdoors:</b> There is so much to explore outside between forests, beaches and our own backyard.
July 7th – 11th	<b>Theater Works:</b> Campers learn and experiment with creating sets and props while working on presentation and acting skills
July 24 <sup>th</sup> – 18th	<b>Top Chefs:</b> Campers learn to create international foods while learning to read a recipe, measure, calculate quantities and portions.
